

**Question:** At primary school, I could just talk to my child's teacher. How will I know how my child is doing at school when there are so many different teachers?

**Answer:** In the first few weeks of term, you will get a phone call from your child's form tutor who will discuss how well your child is settling into school life. Use your child's planner to find out their timetable, homework and deadlines. This also contains information about their current level of attainment and their targets for the end of the year. At different points during the term, the children will bring home their books. If you are worried about their progress or work, just give the school a ring because the teachers are always happy to talk to you. Your child will get a report at the end of the Autumn and Summer term and there is a parents' evening in the Spring term.

**Answer:** When your child changes school, it is natural to be a bit worried and concerned, but your child is not the only one who forgets to give in letters and loses their homework. As they get older, they do become more responsible and the staff are really experienced and will soon find out who needs an extra bit of help with organisation.


