- establish the foundations of a whole school approach to careers in the curriculum that will be relevant beyond the academic year and create a sustainable approach for the future.

Young people critically need **support** to see and understand their future during this time of great uncertainty. Careers learning is invaluable in **creating optimism, fostering wellbeing and motivation**, and giving young people a **sense of purpose** for their subject learning, which encourages them to **strive to achieve**.
