Year 11 Geography Field Trip

This week our Year 11 Geographers have been out in the local area as part of their Geography work. Both Miss Wileman and Miss Owen's classes took a short trip to Thurmaston Retail Park to answer the question;

'How has the development of an out of town Retail Park influenced consumption in Leicester?'

Students completed a traffic and pedestrian survey along with a land use survey. Students then asked local shoppers about their shopping habits and their thoughts about out of town Shopping Centres.
